### **Spring**

#### **Oyster Festival – We** are the ouster **CASTROPOL**

During the May long weekend. Castropol pays tribute to its oysters with tastings, cooking demonstrations, visits to the ouster farms, music on the dock, and workshops for all ages. A tasty and fun event next to the Eo.

It is an opportunity to share with neighbors and visitors in a festive and welcoming atmosphere.

#### Rosca Fair SAINT EULALIA OF OSCOS

### Saint Joseph's Festival

#### TARAMUNDI

Every March 19th, the feast of Saint Joseph. Taramundi celebrates one of its major festivals. A solemn Mass, a vermouth session, a popular barbecue, and a street party enliven two days of gatherings and tradition. There are also children's games and an atmosphere for all ages. Taramundi Cheese and Local Products Fair. Every year on the Saturday of Holy Week, the most important cheese fair in western Asturias is held in the municipal sports center.

### Cheese and Local Products Fair

#### **TARAMUNDI**

This annual event stands out for the wide variety of Asturian cheeses and other local products on sale, and for its festive atmosphere with bagpipe music. At this fair, in addition to more than twenty cheese factories among its exhibitors, you can also see artisan cutlery and other agricultural products such as cider. bread, and honey, among others.

#### Trade Fair VEGADEO

Commercial tradition and festivities come together every June at one of the most iconic events in western Asturias and the surrounding regions of Galicia. Exhibitors of local and local products. workshops, gastronomy with the traditional pulpo á feira (octopus á feira), concerts, and street parties fill Vegadeo with life throughout the weekend. A unique event where the town comes together and the region unites.

### Holy Week of Piantón and Vegadeo VEGADEO

With more than 250 years of history, Holy Week in Piantón is one of the oldest in western Asturias. Its articulated floats and the traditional "Bandeo de Pendones" (Band of Banners) are particularly noteworthy, full of symbolism. Amidst processions, music, and community participation, experiencing it is like immersing yourself in a sober, unique, and deeply rooted celebration. Holy Week in Vegadeo is also one of the most significant and participatory in the entire region.

# Our Lady of Mount Carmel CASTROPOL

Every August, Figueras passionately celebrates the Fiestas del Carmen (Festival of Carmen), in honor of the Virgin of Carmen, patron saint of sailors. This festival is one of the most important and moving in the municipality of Castropol, where the sea, faith, and tradition intertwine. The most anticipated moment is the maritime procession, in which residents take the Virgin by boat along the Eo estuary, accompanied by decorated vessels and lateen-sailed boats.

### Saint James' Day

In Castropol, the Day of Saint James is celebrated on July 25th as a local holiday, and also around this time is the anniversary of the Puente de los Santos (All Saints' Bridge), which connects the municipalities of Castropol and Ribadeo.

### Pixota Craft Fair CASTROPOL

This fair is held in Figueras on the last weekend of July or the first weekend of August. It stands out for its focus on local crafts, seafaring culture, and traditional cuisine, making it a must-attend event for residents and visitors alike.

# Patron Saint Festivities SAINT MARTIN OF OSCOS

On the second weekend of July, San Martín celebrates its patron saint's day with a street party, mass, a procession, and a vermouth session to the rhythm of bagpipes. A lively and welcoming atmosphere in the heart of western Asturias, ideal for joining in the festivities, meeting the people, and enjoying the living traditions of the municipality.

### Summer

#### Biosphere Reserve Market SAINT MARTIN OF OSCOS

On the last weekend of July, San Martín de Oscos hosts this market that celebrates the identity of the Río Eo, Oscos, and Terras de Burón Biosphere Reserve. The day offers guided tours of the Mon Palace, live music, craft workshops, children's activities, and exhibitions of traditional crafts. This is a must-see for enjoying the region's culture and natural surroundings.

### Livestock Competition SAINT MARTIN OF OSCOS

On the last weekend of August, the fairgrounds host this event dedicated to the Asturiana de los Valles breed. Ranchers from across the region present their best cattle in a rural and festive atmosphere, with prizes, exhibitions, and local pride. An event that highlights the municipality's livestock tradition.

# Patron Saint Festivities of San Juan SAINT TIRSO DE ABRES

(June 24, bonfire and sardine feast) On June 24, El Llano is filled with music, tradition, and fire. The night of San Juan begins with a huge bonfire and continues with a festival, and the following day, a procession, mass, and a floral carpet decorate the big day. A complete celebration, with rural flavor and authentic hospitality.

#### San Roque SAINT EULALIA OF OSCOS

(August) On the last weekend of August, Santalla celebrates San Roque with a parade, a popular cider festival, a street party, mass, and a procession. The festivities continue the following Saturday with the traditional Millarado Countryside Picnic: an open-air meal, games, and bagpipes. A lively and friendly atmosphere, ideal for enjoying summer in the mountains. Meeting of blacksmiths from Santa Eulalia de Oscos.

### Celtic Night and "Ace of the 15th"

#### **VEGADEO**

Vegadeo celebrates its major patron saint festival around August 15th, in honor of the Assumption and San Roque. The festive atmosphere kicks off with the popular Celtic Night (the previous Saturday) and continues with religious services, open-air dances with renowned orchestras, and the traditional picnic in the El Noveledo Recreation Area (the following Sunday). Live music, theater, dance, children's workshops, and a craft market bring this historic site to life. A celebration that fuses tradition and modernity, inviting everyone to enjoy local culture in a unique setting.

### Other local festivals VILLANUEVA DE OSCOS

- Santa Ana (La Garganta): July 26. Traditional livestock fair with more than 500 years of history.
- San Miguel (La Garganta): Sunday before September 29.
- Santa María (Villanueva): September. The exact date may vary, so it is recommended to check the local program.

# Ornithological days in the Eo Estuary CASTROPOL

(October-November) Every autumn, Castropol hosts these birdwatching days in one of the most valuable natural areas in northern Spain: the Eo Estuary, a Biosphere Reserve. (October/November) Every autumn, Santalla pays tribute to its most illustrious resident, the Marquis of Sargadelos, with talks, tours, and cultural activities. The events, organized by the Association of Friends of Antonio Raimundo Ibáñez, invite visitors to learn about his enlightened legacy in his birthplace and in the heart of the region. An ideal event for lovers of history and thought.

### Magosto or Chestnut Festival

### SAINT EULALIA OF OSCOS

(November) Every October 31st, Santa Eulalia de Oscos celebrates its traditional Magosto, an autumn festival where locals and visitors gather at the sports center to enjoy roasted chestnuts, sweet cider, pork rinds, and ham. The evening is enlivened with live music, creating a cozy atmosphere that celebrates the arrival of autumn and local traditions.

Around November 11th, San Martín de Oscos celebrates its traditional San Martín Fair, a day that combines a livestock exhibition with a lively market featuring local products and crafts. If the date falls on a weekday, the fair is moved to the following Saturday.

### Meredo Chestnut Festival VEGADEO

(late October - early November) Every autumn, the town of Meredo celebrates one of its most cherished festivals: the Chestnut Festival, which brings together locals and visitors around traditional cuisine, music, and conviviality. ### Livestock Fair in honor of St. Eulalia SAINT EULALIA OF OSCOS

Every December 10th, Santa Eulalia de Oscos celebrates its traditional Livestock Fair in honor of its patron saint. This event, which marks the close of the livestock calendar in the Oscos region, brings together ranchers, artisans, and residents for a day that combines tradition and community. In addition to the livestock exhibition, the fair offers stalls selling local products and cultural activities, reflecting the area's rural roots.

# Traditional music and dance in Oscos – Eo

#### Sounds that move, rhythms that unite.

Traditional music is the sonorous soul of the region. At every pilgrimage, market, or local festival, the notes of a bagpipe or the beating of tambourines awaken memory and the heart.

#### Instruments that do not fail

- Asturian bagpipes: protagonists of processions, parades and festivals.
- Tambourines: they keep the rhythm at parties and community dances.
- **Pilgrimage songs**: lyrics that are repeated generation after generation, accompanied by clapping and steps.

One of the most anticipated items is the **Roscas de San Román**, which were traditionally made at home and can now also be found in local bakeries, exclusively on that day.

Oscos-Eo's festivals are local, rural, and ever-changing. Many don't have fixed dates, and their programs are published at short notice or only on local social media. To make sure you don't miss anything, we recommend following these tips:

# Confirm dates and times

- Contact local tourist offices or city halls to confirm exact dates and locations.
- Check local websites such as:

### Get ready for the rural

- Wear comfortable clothing and sturdy footwear.
- Don't forget a jacket, even in summer.
- · Have cash on hand: not all events accept credit cards.
- If it's a pilgrimage or market, bring a small backpack or reusable bag.
- Respect the environment and traditions; be a part of the place.

# How to get there and get around

- · Some villages have limited or no mobile access.
- · Check road conditions in case of storms.
- · Carpool if possible.
- Ask about local or public transportation during holidays (sometimes there are special buses).

# Experience the festivities from within

- You don't come here just to watch: you're expected to participate, sing, dance, or eat.
- · You don't have to know anyone: you'll be invited anyway.
- Ask, chat, and say thank you. The most valuable thing you can take away from here is a shared history.
