



A natural paradise that is experienced at a different pace

The Oscos-Eo region is a haven of calm where nature and rural life go hand in hand. Forests, rivers, and gentle mountains create a serene landscape, perfect for unwinding. Here, tourism is experienced slowly, valuing traditional crafts, authenticity, and contact with nature. Distinctions such as the Biosphere Reserve, the Natura 2000 Network, and natural monuments attest to its environmental and scenic richness.

Oscos-Eo is a **land of gentle contrasts**: deep forests, rivers that whisper through valleys, mountains that hug the horizon, and beaches that touch the Asturian-Galician border. Here, every corner holds **silence and beauty**.



Forests that embrace the landscape

The forests of Oscos-Eo envelop the land with their greenery and tranquility. From the **chestnut forests tended** for generations to the **beech and oak groves of the Biosphere Reserve**, every corner invites you to wander leisurely. On the banks of the Eo and Agüeira Rivers, the riparian forests accompany the flow of water. Cool paths, ancient trees, and natural silence make these landscapes a **refuge for walking**, **listening**, and **breathing deeply**.






Rivers and valleys

The Eo River and its tributaries shape **fertile valleys teeming with life. Pools, waterfalls, old mills**, and peaceful paths emerge along its banks. The marshes near the estuary are ideal for **birdwatching**, while the **trails invite you to walk and discover the landscapes** at a leisurely pace. These river landscapes are also gateways to the sea, where the rural surroundings blend with the Atlantic breeze. **A perfect place to relax**.

Gentle mountains: Sierra de la Bobia and Sierra del Ouroso

There are no steep peaks in Oscos-Eo, but there are mountain ranges that offer open horizons and peaceful trails. The Sierra de la Bobia and Sierra del Ouroso allow you to connect with the land from above, with **trails for everyone** and panoramic views that deserve a pause.





Beaches: Penarronda and Arnao

Just a stone's throw from the greenery, the coast is a surprise. Beaches like Penarronda, Arnao, and San Román preserve their **natural character**. **They are peaceful spaces, with dunes, marshes, and cliffs. The sound of the sea and the rural silence** blend along their shores, creating a perfect ending to any trip.

Protected areas with a rural soul

Río Eo, Oscos and Terras de Burón Biosphere Reserve

Declared in **2007**, it covers 1,600 km² between Asturias and Galicia, where **the Eo River winds through oak and chestnut forests**. It's a natural refuge for wildlife such as wild boars and otters. A space of tradition, nature, and **sustainable** development, ideal for unwinding and enjoying unspoiled landscapes. Partial Nature Reserve of the Eo Estuary


This estuary between Asturias and Galicia is a **unique ecosystem** where **river and sea waters** mix, creating a nutrient-rich biotope. Ideal for **migratory birds** and wildlife adapted to its fluctuations. Recognized as a **Special Protection Area for Birds (SPA)** and a **RAMSAR Wetland**, it is a **natural and ornithological paradise**. The estuary, with the Eo River, is a site of community interest, as is the Agüeira River basin.

Penarronda Beach Natural Monument

Located in the westernmost part of Asturias, this 600 m beach is famous for its dunes and unique biodiversity. It's home to endangered species such as the sea wallflower and the sea dogfish. Despite its deterioration due to tourism, the dune system is being restored. It is a refuge for seabirds and otters.

(Castropol)

Castropol-Figueras Coastal Walk

Between marshes, windmills and wind-blown inlets, this route skirts the Eo estuary like someone strolling through a changing painting.

(Saint Martin of Oscos)

Route from Piorno to os Fornos

Highly recommended, as it preserves excellent examples of traditional Oscan architecture in stone, slate, and wood. Here, the landscape will surprise us with its contrasts between rugged and gentle, with its sounds: the Soutelo River, the birds, the abundant native vegetation, and the numerous wildlife.

Easy - 5.5 km round trip. Panoramic and peaceful.

A route through riparian forests and ancient cortios, buildings that protected beehives from bears. Nature, history, and tradition make for an easy and enjoyable walk.

(Taramundi) Route of the Ferreiros

A walk through forests and ethnographic heritage. A journey into the world of blacksmiths. Along this route, you'll visit several artisanal cutlery workshops, as well as the Mazonovo Mill Museum, which also formerly served as the Mazo Mill. Near the end, a visit to the Taramundi Cutlery Museum will help you understand the importance of the legacy of the cutlery trade.

Easy - short (8 km) - full of history.

Gentle, well-marked trails through the mountains, with open views that invite leisurely strolls. Ideal for a peaceful experience surrounded by nature.







Bird watching


The Eo estuary and its surroundings are a paradise for birdwatching, especially in **autumn** and winter and during **migrations**. Here you can spot mallards, common teals, wigeons, grey herons, little egrets, great cormorants, curlews, sandpipers, plovers, and spoonbills. The observatories of A Lieira, Salías, La Linera, and Vilavedelle, together with the **Eo Estuary Path**, **the Castropol-Figueas Coastal Path**, **and the Villadún lagoon**, offer privileged spots from which to enjoy birdlife in its natural habitat.







Visitable mines in Oscos-Eo

Oscos-Eo preserves mining vestiges, some of which can now be explored on foot. In Villanueva, the most notable are **As Cárquivas** (Roman gold), **Busdemouros** (iron and copper), and **Peña Tascón**, where iron with lead and zinc was extracted. The loading bay, trench, wagons, railway, and galleries are still preserved. In San Martín, the **Carmina mine** preserves galleries; we can see drag ramps, sluice gates, a winch, and ore at the site itself. **Excomulgada** offers a marked trail; in San Martín, you can also visit the Arruñada mine, an ancient gold deposit exploited by the Romans, or visit the Peña Teixeira mine. In Santa Eulalia, the **As Talladas route** runs through mining remains among forests and leads you to the Carmina mine in the neighboring municipality of San Martín de Oscos. **History, landscape, and heritage** go hand in hand underground.
